



Luke 2:8 And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. ⁹ An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. ¹⁰ But the angel said to them, “Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. ¹¹ Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. ¹² This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger.” ¹³ Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, ¹⁴ “Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests.” ¹⁵ When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, “Let’s go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about.” ¹⁶ So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. ¹⁷ When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, ¹⁸ and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them.

#Presence

In the dark of your night is often when God is preparing to bring forth light (Christ) who provided for our needs and the announcement of your miracle (Luke 2:8).

The birth of Christ is meant for everyone (Luke 2:10) “all people” even those who weren’t awaiting a Messiah.

What are people looking for- or need to be looking for but don’t know it? (Luke 2:12) They are in search of Jesus/ Our Savior and like the shepherds did we too have encountered Him and can point other people to Him (Luke 2:17).

If peace with God is a fleeting thing based upon one’s own actions then that would mean Jesus just returned your present (John 14:27).

Because we have the peace (*eirēnē*) of God given to us through Jesus, we please (*eudokia*) God and God is kindly benevolent towards us and there is no wrath (Luke 2:14).
